The MOAA Nassau Florida Chapter will be having its monthly meeting on 12 March 2024 @ 0530 PM. Our speaker will be Melissa Yuchasz. She is the Executive Director of YMCA at Wildlight and co-leads Military Outreach Initiatives in the 6-county service area of YMCA of Florida's First Coast. Melissa began her YMCA career when her husband was stationed at Naval Station San Diego. She started working for the YMCA of San Diego County in 2011 as a Wellness Coach and Personal Trainer. After a short time, Melissa was promoted to Wellness Coordinator leading a staff team and wellness programming and then promoted again to Wellness Director taking on



additional responsibilities. In 2017, Melissa's husband was assigned to Naval Station Mayport, and they moved their small family of 3 to Jacksonville. She quickly found work at the Brooks Family YMCA as their Healthy Living Director. In this role her main accomplishment was helping YMCA of Florida's First Coast launch the Y's cancer survivor program, LIVESTRONG, at the YMCA. This program is now facilitated in multiple YMCAs in Northeast Florida and has helped hundreds of cancer survivors

increase their quality of life. Melissa was promoted to Associated Executive Director and moved to McArthur Family YMCA in 2019 then promoted again and moved to YMCA at Wildlight in 2020 where she was responsible for opening a brand-new facility at the height of the COVID pandemic.

As always, spouses are invited and encouraged to attend, since they are a key component of the group and can contribute with valuable input. As a reminder, in accordance with our arrangement with the golf club, if you reserve dinner, you have obligated the chapter for your dinner expense and will be requested to reimburse the chapter. 
